New Website Offers Georgians Updated Resources to Assist with Emissions Testing

ATLANTA (Nov. 3, 2022) – Georgia's Clean Air Force (GCAF), in partnership with the Georgia Environmental Protection Division (EPD), announces the launch of its new and improved website, <a href="https://www.cleanairforce.com">www.cleanairforce.com</a>, as a comprehensive resource for metro Atlanta motorists seeking to complete their annual emissions test.

Along with a new design and improved user-friendly features, the website now includes a translation option of program information throughout the website into Spanish, Korean, Vietnamese and Mandarin Chinese, along with an online comment card in Spanish. For current and prospective inspectors, an online interactive practice test has been added.

A plethora of program information is available for motorists, inspection stations, and the repair industry. Specifically for motorists, the website offers tips on what to do before and after testing, including retest and repair information. Additionally, the website includes a vehicle inspection report summary look-up tool, location search for inspection stations via zip code, and waiver, exemption, and extension information.
